

HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS

JUNE/JULY

15 Michigan students* travel to Shiga and stay with a host family for 2 weeks, experiencing Japanese school and daily life.

*Students are accompanied by 2 adult chaperones

AUG/SEPT

The 15 Shiga students who hosted come to stay with their Michigan student and her/his family for 2 weeks and attend school.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Students currently in 9th, 10th, or 11th grade in Michigan may apply to participate.
- Applicants should be open-minded, flexible, and willing to accept new challenges.
- Applicants must have passport that is valid for at least 3 months past the program end date.
- Applicants must submit a completed application by the deadline.





BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Michigan-Shiga High School Exchange is a program of the Michigan-Shiga Sister State Board, a non-profit committee that has overseen activities and exchanges between the State of Michigan and Shiga Prefecture since the sister-state relationship was established in 1968. Hundreds of Michigan high school students have traveled to Japan and hosted their Japanese friends since the exchange began in 1990, contributing to the mutual understanding and appreciation that exists between our two states and countries.

ABOUT JCMU

The Japan Center for Michigan Universities (JCMU) coordinates the Michigan-Shiga High School Exchange on behalf of the Michigan-Shiga Sister State Board. Founded in 1989 on the 20th anniversary of the Michigan-Shiga relationship, JCMU has educated thousands of students in Japanese language, culture, and various other fields of study through its diverse selection of college study abroad programs.

PROGRAM CONSIDERATIONS

- Selected applicants & parent(s)/guardians must attend the orientation in East Lansing.
- Applicants and their families must be able to host their Shiga student for two weeks in August/September (including attending the Welcome & Farewell events).
- The high school that the applicant attends must be willing to welcome a Japanese student and allow her/him to attend classes for two weeks.
- For applicants, previous study of Japanese language is helpful, but is not required.
